How will your fundraising help?

At Dogs Trust, we care for around 13,000 dogs every year at our network of 22 rehoming centres across the UK and Ireland. We're the best place for dogs in need. When a dog is at risk, we help them get back on their paws with healthcare, training, rehabilitation – and lots of love, of course!

We are reliant on voluntary donations and, without the help of wonderful people like you, we simply wouldn't be able to care for thousands of dogs each year.

Charity of the year

This is a great way to get everyone at school involved in raising awareness and funds for Dogs Trust. You can use the ideas in this guide for inspiration on ways to fundraise throughout the school year.



Pancake Day

Celebrate Pancake Day with unlimited pancakes in return for donations.

Bake sale

Why not bake some delicious 'pup cakes' and sell them at school or in your local area to raise funds for our furry friends? You could even hold your own Great British Bark Off!

Go bright yellow

Encourage everyone to wear yellow and donate £1 to Dogs Trust. The whole school could wear their brightest clothes or favourite yellow accessory.

Sports Day

Get your whole school involved in a day of sport and fun. Why not include some dog-themed activities like a tennis ball and spoon race?



Sponsored walk

Set a location/distance and get everyone involved in a sponsored walk. You'll be helping dogs every step of the way.



School talent show

Showcase your hidden talents and hold a talent show! Ask for an entry donation for those taking part and for those who want to come along and watch.



Hold a read-a-thon and ask family and friends to sponsor you!





Pumpkin carving

Hold a pumpkin carving/ drawing competition, with prizes for the winning pumpkin and make it dog themed!

Christmas fair

You could hold a craft fair at any time of the year-get crafty and sell your homemade masterpieces! At Christmas time, you could even make and sell your own Christmas cards.

Movie night

Host your own movie night and get creative with the theme depending on the time of year. A dog-themed film would work too!



Drawing contest

Why not show off your best drawing skills by drawing a famous dog, your favourite breed or maybe one of the dogs on the Dogs Trust website?

Raffles and lotteries

Many types of raffles and lotteries are regulated and have set rules about how they are run. The easiest type that is unregulated to run is an 'incidental lottery' which uses a standard raffle ticket book.

Remember these top tips:

- Only sell tickets in person or at your event, not online or in advance of your event (unless you have a license).
- You can charge any price for your tickets and even offer a promotional deal, e.g. 3 for 2.
- Your prize draw should take place at your event or after it has finished.
- Double check you are running your raffle legally by checking on the Gambling Commission website:

Health and Safety

It is important to make sure everyone at your event stays safe while having fun. Dogs Trust cannot accept responsibility for accidents, so make sure your event is safe for everyone involved. If you're going to be carrying money around, always use a safe route and always have someone with you.

Insurance

If you organise an event that involves the public, you will need to make sure you have adequate public liability insurance. Dogs Trust is not able to provide liability insurance for events.

Food safety

If you are selling food, please consider food safety laws and work to basic rules for safe preparation, storage, display and cooking.


